**Dick Bellows** was worth a happy \$ for the warm weather.

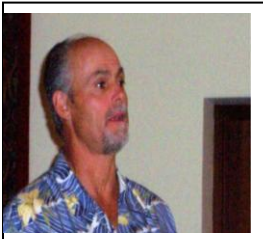
**Bob Young** gave \$5 for **Steve's** great job at giving raffle prizes and for the pirates success at selling keys. also that the Kings finally won a game.

## **PROGRAM LAST MONDAY**

B J Ford our program speaker for the day is now working toward the development of a Cultural, History and Art Center for Yolo County. Basically this facility will “promote Yolo County’s rich history and unique culture through artistic, educational, and social activities and events for individuals of all ages and cultural back grounds. Our goal is to engage, educate and enlighten people about Yolo County’s history and influence on the world of ideas, and culture through captivating stat-of-the art experiences.”

She told us how, through Lois Wolk the Historical Society had gotten onto the Cultural Endowment Fund of the State and have been awarded \$200,000 so far. A county wide study of sites, with a site to be donated by the Yolo County Board of Supervisors on Oak St between 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> St having been selected. A possibility of \$20 million overall still available for all such projects in the state. An architectural plan has been prepared of a 17,600 sq ft building costing \$30 million in matching funds. The target date for completion of the project was originally August of 2010 but with the economy the way it is this date has been put off until when?

B. J. said we were one of the first organizations to be addressed about this project and that a lot better preparation would be needed to sell it to future groups. She liked the cup but needed a new bell.
