TODAY'S PROGRAM

Our program for today was about the Kiwanis Cal-Nev-Ha Foundation and what it means to Kiwanis. The program was presented by our own Marv Hale who was a Past Ambassador of the Foundation. Marv has put on a similar program in past years. He used to have to rely on a flip chart for his program. The Foundation finally came up with three 20 minute power point programs which Marv condensed in order to be able to present a program for a single meeting.

The Foundation is the Finance Raising and Service Giving part of Kiwanis. They provide funding for disaster aid, scholarships to Sponsored Youth, grants for Kiwanis Club projects, particularly

projects involving Pediatric Trauma. Pediatric Trauma is the emphasis of the Foundation and they partner with six hospitals throughout the District as well as recently having paid for two doctors to be specially educated in PTP and pass this knowledge along to others throughout the District. Funding for the Foundation is from Club Giving programs such as Founders Day and the Distinguished Service Award. Major individual funding is from William A Dunlap fellowship purchases and Legacy Fellowships.

Grants to Clubs are not difficult to get and most only require filling out the papers. Woodland received a Club Grant of ¼ the cost of The Ferns Park Service project several

years back. We are expecting to get a Grant for \$400 toward our investment in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes award for sending four students to camp this month. Marv hopes that we will put on a major bike rodeo someday. The Grant for this program will be 50% of our cost.
