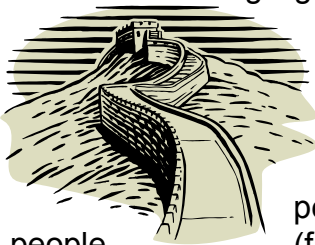
### HAPPY SAD \$\$
