The event was a huge success and instead of providing the meal for an expected 60 people the count was more like 90. It wasn't because they smelled the hamburgers barbequing, because like last year the grill did not work and we had to grill them inside. Food consumed included 144 hamburgers and 36 cans of beans.

After organizing our Wayfarer Project Roz described how she had “been in the right place at the right time” and had had a lot of good experience with the beginnings of the Mission up to when it took hold. As a neophyte nurse at Yolo General Hospital she got to work the night shift a lot and got to know many of the homeless people in Woodland. Her church and several others had formed an Ecumenical Ministry and she got them to start feeding the street people. Of the 5 churches involved in the Ministry one would feed the homeless each day covering 5 days of the week. She cooked the meal from her church. The New Testament Church saw a need for this service ,also, and they fed and housed other homeless at a house that the Mission main building replaced. Both the Ecumenical and The New Testament operations folded up for several years. When they got going again the New Testament Organization asked the Ecumenical Ministry to resume their help with the cooking program. Roz said she would do it for her church and still is.
