Program was brought to us by Buildrite a Division of Cleanrite with headquarters in Chico and subsidiaries all over northern Calif. and serving the area since 1959. They gave us a run down on water damage incl. the three types: 1. Clear water from supply sources. 2. Grey Water like wash water and 3. Black Water like toilet water. Then they proceeded to tell us how to dry with air flow and without airflow and finally including chemicals and protective gear for clean up of toilet run overs. They told us to get a firm with I.I.C.R.C. rating to clean up our problems. Also to be sure of what our insurance covers. They also told us all about mold. They showed us a power point show of the mold that happened in a house that had been closed up with a pipe leak for only 3 1/2 months. It was not too appetizing. They described some other moldy problems as well as telling us how they suited and masked up, used scrubbers to clean air and then killed mold with bioside. We now know how bad things are with water and mold damage. Maybe I will let somebody else do the clean up next time.
