### PROGRAM

Cass Sylvia gave us a good program about what the Public Guardian Public Administrator Department of the county does. Some of the background information that she gave us included: That she has been the elected Public Guardian/Public Administrator of Yolo County for 15 years. Yolo County’s Office is only one still elective in State with the rest having been absorbed into other departments A/C economics. Ten years ago there were 11 employees assisting her and now there are only 6 and work load has increased.

Her duties as Public Guardian are having responsibility, as authorized by the Superior Court, for seeing to the daily food, clothing, shelter, and/or financial needs of mentally and/or physically disabled persons as well as authorizing medical treatment for them. As Public Administrator she is responsible for investigating and administrating the estates of persons who die in Yolo County without a will or without a relative in the state willing or able to act as administrator.

Of particular interest in her presentation were the descriptions of examples which have arisen in the administration of the various duties of her office. Among these were: a deceased with a house full of envelopes, selling a house in this declining estate market, dealing with a

mentally disturbed boy who didn't care about coming in out of the heat and got dehydrated, protecting a property poor oldster who was being taken by a friend.

She closed her formal presentation with a description of the Indigent Burial Program. Deceased with descendents who are Yolo County residents and have an estate under \$2000 are assisted by this program. She invited us to attend a celebration for those assisted by this Program in the last year at the Annual County Memorial Service on Friday, May 29 , 11-12 at Knights Landing Cemetery .
